Indicator	Casts a compelling vision for the future

1	Meditate on Exodus 3:7-10; Proverbs 29:18; Jeremiah 29:11; 1 Corinthians 2:9-16. Memorize one or two of these verses.	Do research to identify the current condition, the expected future, and the gap between the two for the following (choose one to focus on): your nation, your generation, your church, your family.	Build relationships with people who have similar vision. Discuss in order to learn from each other about how to cast the vision more clearly.	Study Exodus 3:7-10; Proverbs 29:18; Jeremiah 29:11; 1 Corinthians 2:9-16.
2	Thank God for creating you to be who you are, with your unique calling.	Recall specific experiences where people followed you because of the vision you shared with them. Write down how it happened. What was the impact? Was there any change?	Find role models who have strong vision and learn from them including how they nurture and share vision. Interview one or two of these leaders.	Read the Bible to understand the nature of God's vision and how He revealed His vision to the people.
3	Pray that God will give you a heart of compassion and open eyes and ears like Jeremiah, so that you receive clarity about His calling for you.	Cast your vision to one person or group every week. Evaluate after – what were their responses? Adjust accordingly the next time you cast the vision.	Share your vision with your prayer partner and ask them to keep you accountable.	Study examples of people who cast a compelling vision for others (for example, Joshua or Nehemiah).
4	Reflect on those things that make you feel holy discontent and compel you to pursue God. Pray that God would give you clarity and passion to pursue them.	Participate in a certain movement which connects with your vision.	Discuss your vision with a peer and ask them to give you insights and feedback.	Study biblical examples of people who failed to cast a compelling vision and instead pursued their own ambitions and desires. What were the results?
5	Fast and pray regularly for a discerning spirit from God to acknowledge His vision and lead others to own it as well.	Make a journal of your vision and a plan to reach it.	Share the vision with your mentors and ask for their insights and feedback. Ask for them to pray for you and your vision.	Prepare a teaching on the difference between God's vision and human's ambition. Present it to your small group or church.
6	Reflect if you have run away from God's vision; what hinders you from staying on course with His vision? Confess these hindrances, receive His grace, and repent. Renew your commitment in this regard.	Create media to cast your vision (music, teaching, video, printed material, presentation, art, etc.)	Listen to the hearts of people around you and the needs they have. How does your vision relate?	Study how well-known leaders in the world built their vision and convinced people of its importance.
7	Pray that God will reveal His vision for you to bear, e.g. regarding your nation, His church, your generation, your work and your family. Pray through these one at a time.	Refine your vision together with your team. Discipline yourself and your team to evaluate your actions and see if what you are doing still aligns with the vision.	Cast your vision to a wider group of people.	Find and read books and articles about building and casting vision. Ask a spiritual leader for suggestions.
8	Ask the Holy Spirit to guide you in how you should cast that vision to others. Pray for everyone who listens to the vision you share, that God would soften their hearts and open their minds so that they would also own that vision.		Discipline yourself and your team to evaluate your actions and see if what you do still aligns with the vision and keeps focus on the vision. Pray for one another.	Listen to sermons, teaching, and podcasts on casting vision.
9	Pray that God will give you people to come alongside you in pursuit of His vision.			Listen to audio teachings on Spiritual Life by Malcolm Webber – at least one per week.
10				Study examples of the passion and vision of different leaders at different institutions.
11				Spend focused time on the book of Nehemiah, on how Nehemiah found God's vision and pursued it to the end. Make a journal of what you learned from Nehemiah and what are going to do about it; then do it.
12				Read Chapter 3 in Leading: SpiritBuilt Leadership #3 by Malcolm Webber.
